Activity pack

We have collected together a selection of activities that you can do at home with your child. They are based on end of year expectations for Reception so you may need to alter them according to your child's current level of learning. For example, they may only recognise numbers to 10 so will need support with 11-20 or you may want to challenge your child through questioning.

- Numbers to 20 flashcards use for quick recall, order them, count out the correct number of objects to match a numeral or use cards to make calculations.
- Phase 2 and Phase 3 phonics flashcards you could cut them out and play teachers and use these for quick recall. Or you could use them to build words.
- Cut out and order numbers to 20 worksheet
- I spy and count to 20 we have been modelling crossing out the pictures as we count. Children may need help with writing numerals.
- A selection of pictures to write words or simple sentences about.
- Make the paper dice and play games with them or add the spots together.
- Your child has been sent home with three reading books at their level.
