These are a guide only, different children will need different levels of support. All activities work better with an adult helping. However, some can be completed by your child more independently. | Monday | Watch and enjoy the story, Caterpillar Shoes https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=tYa60 LQHrEc Talk about who the caterpillar saw on the way. Can they remember? | Practise recognising and saying all the sounds your child has learned. | Monday Caterpillars and Butterflies | If you can, watch it again, this time pausing to write a list of who the caterpillar meets, e.g. a woodlouse. (Extend where possible to write sentence about the creatures, e.g. A friendly woodlouse was under the rocks.) Perhaps you could even make a little folding book from paper with each page saying who the caterpillar met. | Play 'Picnic on Pluto' (select Phase 3>revise all phase 3, if your child finds this easy, select phase 4) PhonicsPlay https://new.phonicsplay.co.uk | Log in to IXL and practice the 'skills suggested by your teacher' Today have a go at: C.3 Count using stickers - up to 10 C.4 Count on ten frames - up to 10 If you finish these, have a go at some 'recommended skills' | Talk to your child about what they saw. | Tuesday Caterpillars and Butterflies | Watch and enjoy The Very Hungry Caterpillar by Eric Carle: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=75NQ K-Sm1YY Write a list of what the caterpillar ate each day, e.g. On Monday he ate one apple etc. Talk to your child about what they like to eat and write their own list, e.g. On Monday I ate one pizza etc. | Practise recognising and saying all the sounds your child has learned (using flashcards sent home or Espresso) If your child is struggling with any sounds in particular, they could watch the video for that sound on: https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zvq9bdm Play 'Buried Treasure' (select Phase 3>revise all phase 3, if your child finds this easy, select phase 4) PhonicsPlay https://new.phonicsplay.co.uk | Have a look at 'Number of the day' today. | Wednesday | Read the book Big, Bad Bug! (Your child may be able to read this independently using their phonics to build and blend the words). Free Oxford Owl registration will be required to access this. Create a login first, then click on this link to go straight to the book. https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/api/digital books/1215.html Talk about where the bugs were found. Retell the story using the pictures to help. Answer questions such as: Where did Biff find her bug? What do you think a bug is? What do you think they were feeling when Dad found a bug as big as a rat? Can your child write the original story, or write their own version as to where they might find a bug? E.g. I found a bug on my window. My mummy found a bug on her hand. etc. | Practise recognising and saying all the sounds your child has learned using 'Flashcard Speed Trial' on PhonicsPlay https://new.phonicsplay.co.uk Play 'Make a Match' (Phase 3) on Phonics Play | Follow this link: https://www.ictgames.com/mobilePage/t enFrame/index.html Bring up two 'ten frames' on the screen, put different numbers of counters (numbers between 10 and 20) on them and ask your child to work out how many. If there are more than 10, can they work it out by knowing it is 10 and (e.g. 14 is 10 on one ten frame and 4 on the other). Give them a number and ask them to put it on the ten frame.
