













I think the CGP workbooks (what they previously used for homework) could be used for some of the English work as he's lacking literacy instruction. Using this alongside possibly shorter tasks would further embed his SPAG skills. Grammar and punctuation, although still taught and assessed, takes a bit of a back seat in secondary as the curriculum is literature heavy. Much of the nuts and bolts of SPAG are covered during primary so I feel more time on literacy skills now would help to alleviate any gaps further down the line. The workbooks are really good as they promote using the techniques, as opposed to just defining them and getting the children to feature spot. Seesaw is tricky to use for some activities and cannot always upload from my laptop so have to use phone which isn't helpful. It seems every star of the week is praised for doing every single peice if work in the week, I find this unfair, some children are still trying very hard and are deserving just as much. It very much depends on circumstances at home.  More live sessions  Maybe not so much reading/slides to go through before the actual task as this can put my child off before they even start.  Some videos from the children's own teacher/ teachers to go alongside the oak academy style videos would be beneficial to the children so they see a familiar face each day.  Allow work to be printed the night before - 8am is a busy time for working parents.  We have found that Seesaw isn't the easiest of websites/apps to navigate and use, at the beginning we were spending more time trying to get Seesaw to work that doing the actual school work. It was frustrating for us as parents and not a great experience for our children. It has been extremely hard and stressful to use because of these difficulties whilst trying to work full time at home, our children hasn't been able to use Seesaw independently and this has impacted upon their learning. We found that the system used during the first lockdown was far better, the work was more structured with a weekly timetable, it was easier for us to plan the days, if ittled in better when working from home, out children could do the majority of their work independently, they learnt more and there was actually more work. 

I am finding it hard to motivate the children to do physical activities when it only involves our household. Normally, they are both very physically active. In my opinion, whilst core subjects will need to be a focus for catching up, please do not dismiss the importance of physical activities and general social interaction that the children have lost. This is not just in school. Play dates and sleep overs and all those normal things the children do has not been possible for almost 12 months. This includes school trips etc, where children have to learn to cope in different and sometimes challenging (but fun) environments and learn to work as a team and be independent. Despite trying to give children chores and responsibilities, the children become over reliant on their parents when we have been living in each other shoes for so long. I have found it hard to keep xx (Yr1) engaged in learning, whereas xx (yr5) does get on with it but does not necessarily enjoy it. To make him happier (and enjoy it), I have found buddying him up with a friend to do their work has helped. Zoom classes are a new thing for this lockdown but i'm glad they have worked.
